Note by the Secretary-General

- 1. The forty-seventh session of the Committee on the Rights of the Child will be held at the United Nations Office at Geneva from 14 January to 1 February 2008. The first meeting of the session will be convened on Monday, 14 January at 10 a.m.
- 2. In accordance with rule 6 of the provisional rules of procedure, the Secretary-General has prepared, in consultation with the Chairperson of the Committee, the attached provisional agenda for the forty-seventh session. Annotations to the provisional agenda are also attached.
- 3. Pursuant to rule 32 of the provisional rules of procedure, the meetings of the Committee shall be held in public unless the Committee decides otherwise.
- 4. The attention of the States parties is drawn, in particular, to the annotations to item 4, containing the list of reports that will be before the Committee at its forty-seventh session.
- 5. A pre-sessional working group, established in accordance with rule 63 of the provisional rules of procedure, met at the United Nations Office at Geneva from 8 to 11 October 2007.

Item 1. Solemn declaration by new member

6. In accordance with rule 15 of the provisional rules of procedure, the newly elected members of the Committee will make the following solemn declaration in open meeting:

"I solemnly declare that I will perform my duties and exercise my powers as a member of the Committee on the Rights of the Child honourably, faithfully, impartially and conscientiously."

Item 2. Adoption of the agenda

7. Under rule 8 of the provisional rules of procedure, the first item on the provisional agenda shall be the adoption of the agenda, except for the election of officers when required under rule 16. In accordance with rule 9 of the provisional rules of procedure, the Committee may revise the agenda and may, as appropriate, add, defer or delete items. Only urgent or important items may be added to the agenda.

8. Under this item, the Committee may wish to consider its programme of work for the session, as well as any other matter concerning the modalities of discharging its functions under the Convention.

Overdue reports due

10. Under rule 67 of the provisional rules of procedure, the Secretary-General is required to notify the Committee at each session of all cases of non-submission of reports. The full list of initial and periodic reports due under the Convention and the initial reports due under the Optional Protocols can be found in the document on the status of submission of reports (CRC/C/47/2). This document also indicates exceptional measures granted by the Committee to States parties that are encountering problems in complying with the strict time frame for submission of reports established by the Convention in article 44, paragraph 1, or the consideration of whose reports has been delayed. These recommendations apply as exceptional measures taken for one time only.

Item 5. Consideration of reports of States parties

11. A tentative timetable for consideration of reports at the forty-seventh session, prepared by the Secretary-General in consultation with the Chairperson and subject to approval by the Committee, is given below.

- 12. In accordance with rule 68 of the provisional rules of procedure, representatives of the States parties shall be invited to attend the meetings of the Committee when their reports are examined. Such representatives should be able to answer questions put to them by the Committee and make statements on reports already submitted by their State, and may also submit further information. In accordance with its decision no. 8 related to the consideration of reports under the two Optional Protocols, the Committee may also offer States a choice of technical review for the consideration of reports under the Optional Protocol on the involvement of children in armed conflict.
- 13. In accordance with rule 68 of the Committee's provisional rules of procedure, the Secretary-General has notified the States parties concerned of the opening date, duration and place of the forty-seventh session of the Committee, at which their respective reports will be examined, and has invited them to send representatives to attend these meetings of the Committee.

Item 6. Cooperation with other United Nations bodies, specialized agencies and other competent bodies

14. Under this item, the Committee will pursue its discussion of ways and areas in which existing cooperation with various relevant bodies could be further strengthened to enhance the promotion and protection of the rights of the child.

Item 7. Methods of work of the Committee

15. Under this item, the Committee will pursue its discussion concerning the organization of its future work, as well as the procedure to be followed in the consideration of reports by States parties and their follow-up, including where necessary areas identified for technical assistance.

Item 8. Days of general discussion

16. In accordance with rule 75 of its provisional rules of procedure, the Committee decided at its forty-sixth session that a general day of discussion would be held during its forty-ninth session devoted to the issue of education in situations of emergency. The day of general discussion will take place on Friday, 19 September 2008. At its forty-seventh session, the Committee will adopt an outline for the discussion day (see CRC/C/47/3, annex). Item 9. General comments

17. Under this item, the Committee will pursue the elaboration of general comments based on the various principles and provisions of the Convention, and specifically on two drafts, one related to the Rights of Indigenous Children and one on Child Participation.

18. Under this item, the Committee will be informed of any developments relating to the schedule of its future meetings.

Item 11. Other matters

19. Under this item, members will discuss such other matters relating to the work of the Committee as may be necessary.
